MESSAGE FROM BOARD CHAIRMAN JOHN WINDWICK

2014 was a good year for the Hockey Alberta Foundation, full of change and progress. We welcomed new staff and new Board members, grew our community presence with new partners and continue to build on existing relationships across the province.

We remain an active and significant supporter of hockey in Alberta through our charitable mandate, focusing on the communities to where we give; the champions and builders, the leaders and the future generations. From the evolution of our Alberta Hockey Hall of Fame Gala to a standalone event, to our ongoing investment in the leadership of the game through the Future Leaders Scholarship Program and our persistent growth in our grants dispersed through the Every Kid Every Community Program.

In 2014 we distributed over \$90,000 in program and player assistance grants to groups across the province through our Every Kid Every Community program alone. Another \$30,000 was invested in the future leaders of our game through Hockey Alberta Future Leaders Development Program support and scholarships. Eleven coaches and officials received post-secondary scholarships because of their past, current and hopefully future contribution and commitment to being a leader in the game.

The Hockey Alberta Foundation has been fortunate enough to be the charity of choice for a number of significant contributors again in 2014, including the Glencross Roughstock Rodeo, the ATB Financial Classic PGA Pro Am and Quinn's Energy Group. A total of over \$200,000 was received for Every Kid Every Community from these donors and many others this year. Over \$175,000 of this total was raised through events alone. We are so thankful for each of our donors, large and small, as every single dollar can make a positive impact.



Our success is in the numbers, the communities, groups and individuals we can positively impact. With the economic transition in the province, the increase in new Canadian families who call Alberta home and the financial struggles amongst families that exist, we are confident the need for support will continue to rise. With the ongoing support of our donors, partners, Board and volunteers, the Hockey Alberta Foundation is ready for the challenges, changes and growth ahead in 2015.

ALBERTA HOCKEY HALL OF FAME AWARDS GALLERY

We dedicate funds annually to operate and maintain the Alberta Hockey Hall of Fame (AHHF) Gallery. We want to ensure the champions and builders who shaped the game of hockey in Alberta are acknowledged, and that their legacy grows and is not forgotten for future generations.

The AHHF Gallery - which officially opened on November 19, 2005 - is a place where we can reflect on the strength, passion, wisdom and leadership of those champions and builders in our communities.

Each year, individuals and teams are selected and honoured with induction into the AHHF. It is within the AHHF Gallery that items from the induction class such as trophies, medallions, artifacts and stories are displayed for the year.

The AHHF Gallery is located in the Alberta Sport Hall of Fame and Museum, a facility dedicated to the preservation and education of the rich history of hockey and all sport in our communities throughout Alberta.

Early in 2015, we gave the AHHF Gallery a \$13,000 facelift! With a new splash of paint, a slick new floor and some rearranging we brought new life into the space. In June, we will look to transform the gallery again to acknowledge the newest group of champions and builders when we officially welcome the 2015 AHHF Inductees.

Each year we will continue to honour and celebrate the champions and builders of our game through our ongoing support and contribution to the AHHF Gallery. In 2015 - 2016 we are committing another \$10.000 to the inductee display and other maintenance.

FUTURE LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Since the Future Leaders Scholarship program was established in 1998, we have invested annually in the development of great leaders for the future of the game and our communities in Alberta.

The scholarship program operates in alignment with Hockey Alberta's Future Leaders Development Program, which focuses on educating and training our post-secondary student coaches to be strong and effective on-ice leaders.

We firmly believe that establishing a stronger leadership network through education will serve the game of hockey and its communities for many years to come. It is through this investment in leadership that university and college students have the opportunity to learn proper instruction, administration, leadership, technical and tactical skills in hockey and carry those skills into our communities.

After 17 years, we have contributed over \$350,000 to the Future Leaders Development and Scholarship Program which has seen more than 300 students participate and more than \$180,000 in scholarships awarded.

RECIPIENTS

In 2014-2015 we distributed over \$30,000 in program support to Hockey Alberta and scholarships to 10 post-secondary students who demonstrated commitment to the game through leadership and skill development in the areas of coaching and officiating. Of the 10, two were recipients of additional funding, achieving distinguished status, for going over and above the expectations of the program.

EKEC was created to encourage development and access to the game at a grass roots level for every kid in every community in Alberta, not just today, but for future generations.

By accessing EKEC funding, communities have the ability to get kids active in the sport of hockey through the establishment of local community programs and promotional events that meet the needs of increasingly diverse groups of stakeholders and participants.

In 2014-15, we awarded more than **\$90,000** in program and player assistance grants through the Every Kid Every Community program. These funds reached more than

11 different communities with an impact on over 450 kids.

AHHF AWARDS GALA

Presented by the Hockey Alberta Foundation in partnership with Hockey Alberta, the Alberta Hockey
Hall of Fame Gala (formerly the Hockey Alberta Awards Gala) will be hosting the 9th annual event recognizing our Alberta Hockey Hall of Fame Inductees.

The AHHF has been inducting the pioneers, builders and achievers of Hockey in Alberta since 1982. However, it wasn't until 2005 that the AHHF Gallery officially opened, and in 2006 the first AHHF Awards Gala event recognizing the inductees was held.

Each year we look to honour a minimum of four individuals and one team as inductees into the AHHF based on their past and current contributions to the game of hockey in Alberta.

In 2015, we are honored to be inducting Ken Babey, Al Hamilton, George Kallay, Lanny McDonald and the 1979-80 Red Deer Rustlers. Each inductee brings a unique story and history as their contribution and connection to the game of hockey in Alberta.

The evening gala, previously held in Red Deer, Edmonton and for the first time in Canmore, also serves as a fundraiser for the Every Kid Every Community program. To date funds raised at the gala through sponsorship, ticket sales, donations and silent auctions totals over \$120,000.



Ken Babey - is well-known as Canada's winningest post-secondary level hockey coach with Calgary's SAIT Trojans at SAIT Polytechnic in the Alberta Colleges Athletic Conference (ACAC). 27 seasons as head coach; 534 regular and post season victories; 16 ACAC career coaching records including seven ACAC Coach of the Year awards, most first place finishes, and most championships.



Lanny McDonald - was one of the most popular members of the Calgary Flames, enjoyed a 16-year career in the National Hockey League, won the Stanley Cup in 1989 with the Flames, and was enshrined in the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1992.



George Kallay - for more than two decades, he has been committed to athlete development as a player, parent, referee, volunteer, and executive member with Hockey Alberta, the Hockey Alberta Foundation and Hockey Canada.



Al Hamilton - born in Flin Flon, Manitoba, and is an Honoured Member of the Manitoba Hockey Hall of Fame. But his name is synonymous with hockey in and around Edmonton. As a player, Hamilton reached the pinnacle of junior hockey, bridged the National Hockey League and the World Hockey Association with the Edmonton Oilers, and represented Canada internationally.

EVERY KID EVERY COMMUNITY SPEAKER SERIES



In seeking out a new and creative way to spread our message about the Every Kid Every Community (EKEC) Program and engage grassroots hockey supporters in communities across Alberta, we created the Every Kid Every Community (EKEC) Speaker Series pilot project.

In December 2014 we ran the EKEC Speaker Series in the two test communities of Calgary and Grande Prairie.

Through our partnership with ATB Financial we brought former Edmonton Oiler and TSN Radio Host, Jason Strudwick along with TSN Hockey Analyst, Jamie McLennan as entertainment for the lunch event in Grande Prairie. While in Calgary, it was our relationship with the Calgary Flames that we were fortunate enough to have Calgary Flames General Manager, Brad Treliving as our guest speaker.





We were elated with the community support and engagement we received in both. A combined total of \$30,000 was raised through ticket, table, sponsorship and auction donations. Of the money raised a portion remains in the local community to support the mandates of the Every Kid Every Community Program.

In Grande Prairie, Grande Prairie Minor Hockey Association in a partnership with Hockey Alberta Regional Centre Northwest, Grande Prairie Athletic Club and the Grande Prairie Storm along with the Bauer First Shift program are using the Every Kid Every Community funding to run a NEW Try-Hockey Program. The 30 participants will receive brand new equipment to keep, off ice training and on ice skills and instruction.






We look forward to growing this event in 2015-2016, seeking out 4 new Alberta communities interested in partnering with us to host an Every Kid Every Community Speaker Series.








BY THE NUMBERS REVENUE 2014 - 2015
